Maths

Decimals and Percentages
This unit begins by recapping
tenths for both year groups
before moving on to decimals
with up to two decimal places.
Whilst Year 4 focus on
converting between fractions
and decimals, Year 5 are
introduced to percentages.
Year 5 then move on to
thousandths before both year
groups multiply and divide
decimals by powers of 10.

Design and Technology
Fresh Food, Good Food: This
project teaches children about
food decay and preservation.
They discover key inventions in
food preservation and
packaging, then make
examples. The children prepare,
package and evaluate a healthy
snack.

Main Project: Ancient Civilisations

This project teaches children about the history of three of the world's first ancient civilisations: ancient Sumer, ancient Egypt and the Indus Valley civilisation. Children will learn about the rise, life, achievements and eventual end of each civilisation.

PE

Tennis – focus on hand eye coordination and agility.
Athletics- focus on agility, balance, coordination and speed.

Computing- Word Processing
The first lesson focuses on
formatting images and making
them suitable for a poster
advertising a cake sale. The
children will learn new skills and
techniques and apply them to
creating a range of different word
documents such as posters,
letters to parents, job rotas,
recipe cards and e-vouchers.

History / Geography In history, children will the methods of historical enquiry, including how evidence is used rigorously to make historical claims, and discern how and why contrasting arguments and interpretations of the past have been constructed.
