#### Dear Parents/ Carers

This is the last newsletter of 2023 and what a superb week we've had. Monday saw our KS2 children travel to the Waie Inn for their final swimming lesson. They have really enjoyed their weekly lessons and have all gained in both confidence and ability so we are extremely grateful to Wendy, our swimming teacher. It was fantastic to see so many children return to school with badges and certificates to celebrate their success.



Wednesday was all about Nativities as we were treated to not one, but two different performances. Our EYFS performance of Nursery Rhyme Nativity during the afternoon was just magical. #### The Local Offer:

Devon's SEND strategy for 2012-2024 has been produced in collaboration with families and set out how we will improve outcomes for children and young people with SEND in their families.

A local offer gives children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and their families information to help them find the right help and support in their area.

It has two main purposes:

- To provide clear, comprehensive and accessible information about the support and opportunities that are available
- To make provision more responsive to local needs

The Local Offer bring together information about education, health and care services, voluntary agencies, leisure activities and support groups in once place. It includes:

- <u>Education</u>—support in early years, schools and college, including transport
- <u>Health</u>-specialist clinics, support and advice for children and young people with medical needs
- <u>Social care</u> support for personal care and practical assistance, short breaks and personal budgets
- <u>Transitions</u> moving between phases of education and preparing for adulthood
- <u>Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs)</u> the statutory EHCP process explained, including applying for a plan, transfers and reviews
- Information, advice and support—where to get impartial and confidential information, advice and support.

The Local Offer allows children and young people with SEND, their families and service providers to get involved in reviewing and developing services and support in order to make the offer more responsive to local needs and aspirations.

#### Our Graduated Approach to SEND

Here at Lapford Community Primary School, some children will take part in a variety of interventions to help meet their individual needs. For certain children, this will be a short catch up intervention or additional emotional support, whereas for others a more intensive program of support might be needed. Wherever possible, our interventions take place at certain times during the week, so that children do not miss out on the curriculum. They are also delivered in a fun, supportive and positive way by either teaching or support staff. We always welcome your feedback regarding SEND provision so please share your views with us. Any interventions that take place are tracked in childrens' class exercise books or in a separate intervention book, depending on the content. Where progress is seen, the interventions will be either adapted or stopped. Where progress is not seen over time, the child may need to be placed on our SEN register and require an Individual Education Plan (IEP). Before this happens, a meeting will be held with parents/carers, class teachers and our SEN Lead to discuss their child's progress, and a space will be created whereby concerns can be shared, support plans discussed and targets agreed upon. In some instances, we may ask outside agencies to become involved to help support a child's needs or complete further assessments. Where a child has a significant and /or complex needs, an Educational, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) may be required. #### **SEND Parents Forum**

At Lapford Community Primary School, we want parents/carers of children with SEND to feel involved, valued and listened to. With this is mind, we would like to start a Parent/Carer Forum where all those with children with SEND are invited to come together and share their experiences, concerns, and any feedback around their child. This will take place once a half term from 3:00-3:30pm at school.
