Dear Parents/ Carers,

It has certainly felt very wintery the past week, and the children have been enjoying the ice on the playground!

This week we have been reflecting on our school improvement priorities and thinking about our progress and next steps in these areas. One of our priorities centred around enrichment and we wanted to improve the range of extra curricular activities on offer to the children. We are well underway with this.

Clubs

Children can now enjoy a menu of activities to take part in at lunchtimes, from chess through to recorders and multiskills. We hope to continue to expand the activities on offer in line with the children's interests.

Memorable Moments

All topics now include a memorable moment which could be a trip out or a visitor in school. So far this school year we have had a theatre trip, a Viking Day, an evacuation, trips to Tiverton Museum, a Superhero Day and a visit from a planning officer. We have lots more exciting ideas lined up for the rest of the year and feel sure that these memorable moments really help to bring the learning alive for our learners. For the first time, we are also able to offer residential visits for all children in Key Stage 2 (years 3-6) and we are really looking forward to the first of these at the beginning of February.

Sport

This year we have participated in a range of competitive sports fixtures within mid Devon. Children have really benefitted from the opportunity to play competitive sport with or against children from other local schools. This helps to build sportsmanship, confidence and resilience and I have loved having the opportunity to see our children compete in these events. It is my hope that all children leave primary school having had the opportunity to play sport alongside children from other schools.

Mr Healey has recently taken over as PE Lead and I know he has great plans to build upon the range of opportunities already on offer to our children. As well as competitive sport, we have been able to improve our PE provision through the addition of swimming for Key Stage 2. Children have really enjoyed this, and the progress they have made in the pool is phenomenal.

Music

This year we have worked to improve the quality of our music lessons within school. The addition of a class set of glockenspiels has really helped to improve children's opportunities to perform, and weekly singing assemblies have helped to develop confidence in this area. Over the next six months we hope to be able to offer whole class ensemble tuition so that all children gain the experience of learning to play an instrument.

We are very proud that we have been able to increase our peripatetic offer to include drums and flute as well as guitar, and this is something I am keen to develop further. If your child has a particular interest in learning a specific instrument, do let us know as we may be able to find a peripatetic teacher who can teach them in school. It is my ultimate aim to create a Lapford School band, but we need a few more instrumentalists first!

Outdoor Learning

Outdoor learning continues to be a strength at Lapford. As well as our strong offer around play through OPAL we are also able to offer weekly Forest School sessions for part of the year. We cannot wait to get these underway again after half term and Mrs K has some lovely ideas to explore the forest in Spring.

Also look out for a Forest School Festival in the summer, in which we hope to see children from across the Trust joining us to experience our wonderful facilities.

Community Events

The strength of our community is what makes Lapford such a special place to be, and we have loved the opportunities we have had to build links within the community. Using the Congregational Church for Harvest and Christmas services was really special and we look forward to strengthening this relationship. We have also enjoyed singing at a range of community events including the Lapford Revel and the Over 60s Christmas lunch. We are always keen to work collaboratively with the community and would love to hear from any local groups who may like to be involved in a joint project.

There is so much to celebrate in terms of enrichment and I'm sure you can appreciate the improvements that we have made. We will continue to strengthen this area of school life throughout the remainder of the school year.




Kingfishers Spotlight



Louanna is a wonderful example of how our children show compassion and empathy towards each another!






