

What should I already know?

- To be able to explain why a webpage is credible and how we know if we can trust the information
- To check a range of websites when searching to ensure that the information is correct
- To explain the use of different networks (school network, internet etc.) and understand the dangers
- To use 2Email to open, add attachments and respond to emails (from their teacher and their peers). To relate this to our e-safety work.

Key vocabulary

**Internet** – A global computer network providing a variety of information and communication facilities  
**Website** – A page or collection of pages on the World Wide Web  
**Search engine** - A program that searches for and identifies items in a database. Used especially for finding sites on the World Wide Web. An example of a search engine is Google.  
**Credible website** – A website from a source you trust eg. A well-known news outlet  
**Spoof website** – The creation of a website, as a hoax, with the intention of misleading readers that the website has been created by a different person or organisation.  
**Network** - Several interconnected computers, machines, or operations  
**Local area network (LAN)** - A computer network that links devices within a building or group of adjacent buildings, especially one with a radius of less than 1 km.  
**Wide area network (WAN)** - A computer network in which the computers connected may be far apart, generally having a radius of more than 1 km.  
**Copyright** – A law that gives the owner of something (e.g. a picture) the right to say how other people use it  
**Blog** – A regularly updated website or web page, typically one run by an individual or small group.  
**2Blog** – A program on Purple Mash that allows you to create your own blog. It is safer than general blogging sites as the audience is limited to classmates or people in the same school.
